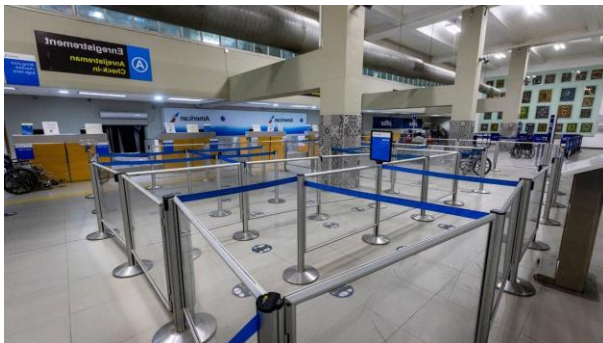
Everything is going well for April, and we continue to help our family in Haiti. The situation in the country has forced us to seek out new ways to keep our Haitian brothers and sisters safe from the chaos that has consumed most of their country. The political situation has seen no improvements, and the gang activity in the capitol has made it increasingly difficult to obtain necessary supplies for the school and orphanage. Pastor Enoch, the staff, and the surrounding community have taken steps to keep the church, school, and orphanage as safe as possible to provide a more normal life for the close to 100 children who call GSP home.

Pastor Enoch and I have discussed the children and what is best for them on multiple occasions over the past year, and there is no good answer.

We have discussed assisting the children in returning to any family they might have or another children's home in the area, but it is so difficult to make those decisions when these children have been at GSP for most of their lives.



FAA bans U.S. travel to Haiti Capitol until September!

The financial cost of continuing to minister to the community has risen beyond what is conceivable for most of us. Three years ago, the monthly cost was between \$3,000 and \$4,000 per month, and those same supplies cost over \$6,000 when all of the needed supplies can be found. The gangs in the capitol take most of the shipments and foreign aid that make it to the port. There is hope that a newly opened airport on the island's southern end will allow supply flights to assist with supply chain issues.

I want to thank all of you for your ongoing support for the work in Haiti and ask that you simply return to your churches and raise awareness of the difficult situation at the Good Samaritan Project and the need to support them financially. These children have known nothing but turmoil for a significant portion of their lives, and anything we can do makes a difference. Pray for Pastor Enoch as he continues to lead them through the most challenging times of his and their lives, as he shares a better way of life for them through Jesus Christ.
